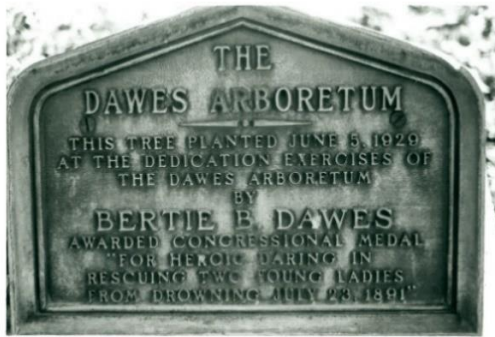
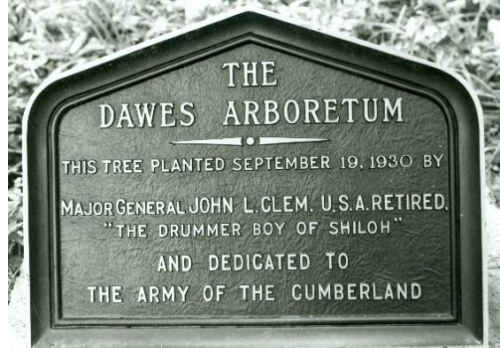

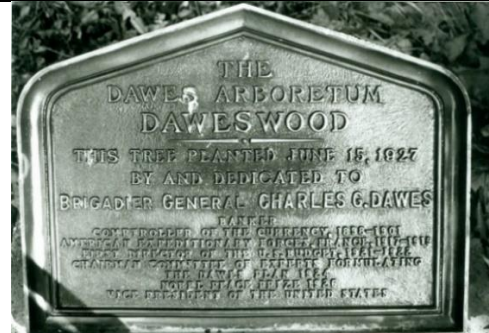
Bertie B. Dawes, 1929

Tree Dedicated: eastern white pine



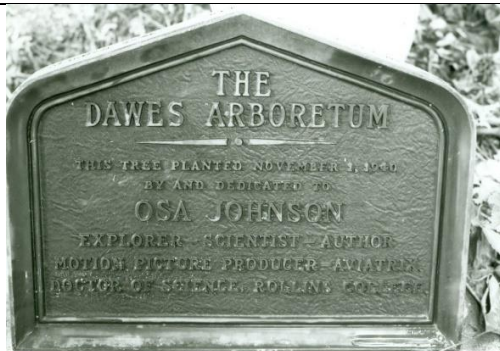
Major General John L. Clem, 1930

Tree Dedicated: swamp white oak

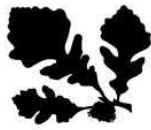


Osa Johnson, 1940

Tree Dedicated: sweetgum

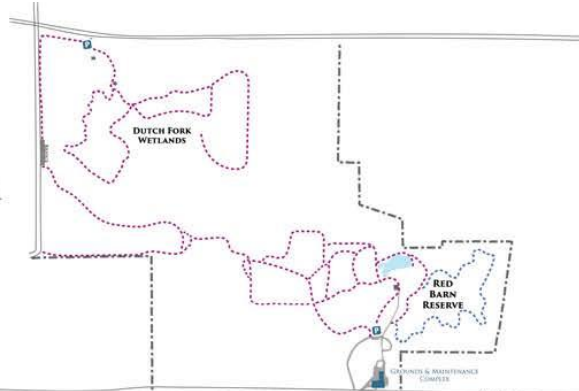


George White, 1932

Hint: Each of these Tree Dedications can be identified by finding their bronze plaque (pictured above). All are located on the North side of The Arboretum near the Daweswood House Museum and most can be found along the Daweswood Trail! The listed tree species may be a helpful clue.



The Dawes Arboretum



Visit the **Red Barn Reserve** to explore meadows, a pond, a boardwalk, wetlands, wooded areas and a rustic barn. With 1.5 miles of trails, the Red Barn Reserve offers visitors plenty to explore. Be sure to visit the seasonal Ohio Butterfly Trail, June through October.

The **Dutch Fork Wetlands** are home to a meadow, observation deck and shelter house, as well as a variety of plants, birds, insects and mammals among 70 acres of restored wetlands.
